## SHIFT TO INNOVATION

I believe there is an imperative to innovation. But before we get there let me say that this is a wilderness time for the church.

It isn't about powering through. It also isn't about hiring the right pastor. Or being the right pastor. Everything has changed.

We are in that liminal space where it is not what it was—it isn't going back there. And it isn't what it will be yet, and we don't know fully what that looks like.

In such a liminal space the Imperative is Innovation.

Our foundation in the Book of Order talk about Openness and Risk "The Church is to be a community of faith, entrusting itself to God alone, even at the risk of losing its life."
